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**REGULATIONS
ON THE ORGANIZATION AND CONDUCT OF
THE EVRAZIA INTERNATIONAL AWARDS
IN 2026**

Moscow, 2026

1. General Provisions

1.1. The Evrazia International Awards (hereinafter referred to as the Awards) are the first-ever international awards aimed at recognizing and supporting outstanding individuals and organizations that contribute to the social, economic, and cross-cultural development of the countries of the Eurasian continent and have made a significant contribution to the preservation of traditional spiritual and moral values, the promotion of public diplomacy, and the overcoming of information barriers between the countries of the Eurasian region.

1.2. Contestants in the Awards may be individuals, legal entities, associations of individuals or arts ensembles.

1.3. These Regulations set forth the procedures and conditions for holding the Evrazia International People's Awards in 2026, including the list of categories, deadlines, eligibility requirements, and the selection process for applications to participate in the Awards.

1.4. The founder of the Awards is ANO Evrazia (hereinafter referred to as the Founder/Organizer), which bears legal and financial responsibility for the conduct of the Awards.

1.5. Information about the Awards is posted on the ANO Evrazia Awards website: premiyaevrazia.su/.

1.5.1. Contestants use the Awards website as an information resource that contains all the details about the Awards and its stages, as well as a link to the application form.

1.5.2. The website is the primary tool for interacting with Contestants.

1.5.3. The website allows users to submit applications, view results for each stage of the Awards, and keep Contestants informed.

1.5.4. International voting will also take place on the Awards website.

1.6. The working language of the Awards is Russian.

2. Goals and Objectives of the Awards

2.1. The Awards are an international prize event designed to recognize and support outstanding individuals, organizations, teams, and arts ensembles:

- that contribute to the social, economic, and cross-cultural development of the countries of the Eurasian continent;
- that have made a significant contribution to the preservation of traditional spiritual and moral values;
- that promote public diplomacy;
- that help overcome information barriers between the countries of Eurasia.

2.2. Goals of the Awards:

- strengthening international cooperation and communication in the fields of social, economic, and cross-cultural development in the countries of the Eurasian region;
- preserving traditional spiritual and moral values;
- identifying and supporting projects that align with the Awards' primary objectives;
- facilitating cooperation between representatives of the regions of the Russian Federation and foreign countries, with a view to implementing socially significant initiatives;
- expanding and strengthening ties between the constituent entities of the Russian Federation and foreign countries;
- the creation of a unified Eurasian space of peace, stability, mutual trust, development, and prosperity;
- the creation of a unified community and communication platform for prominent individuals, organizations, development institutions, businesses, NGOs, and government agencies from various countries, with the aim of preserving traditional values and fostering social, economic, and cultural development in Eurasia.

3. Venue and Dates of the Awards Ceremony

3.1. Timeline for the main phases of the Awards:

- April 7 – August 30 (21 weeks) – Applications for the Awards may be submitted.
- September 7– September 27 (3 weeks) – Expert review of applications to select candidates for the Awards.
- October 5–October 18 (2 weeks) – Open international voting.
- In-person project presentations to the jury, the selection of winners, and the awards ceremony for the Prize winners will take place over 4 days in the period from October 19 to November 15, 2026.

4. The Directorate, the Expert Council, the Organizing Committee, and the Awards Jury

4.1. The Awards Directorate is a team of individuals and legal entities responsible for organizing and holding the Awards.

4.1.1. The Awards Directorate is established for the entire duration of the existence and holding of the Awards, for the purpose of achieving the Awards objectives.

4.1.2. Decisions made by the Awards Directorate within the scope of its authority are binding on Awards Contestants, the Organizing Committee, the Expert Council, and the Jury, as well as on all individuals involved in the organizational and preparatory work.

4.1.3. The Founder and the Awards Directorate have the right to engage partners and sponsors for the Awards at their own discretion.

4.1.3.1. Any individuals or legal entities whose interests align with the Awards' objectives may serve as partners of the Awards.

4.1.3.2. Partners and sponsors are entitled to participate in the various stages of the Awards and the Awards ceremony in accordance with their partnership agreements.

4.1.4. The Founder and the Awards Committee reserve the right to establish additional categories, prizes, and certificates for Awards Contestants.

4.1.5. The Awards Directorate develops and approves the Awards concept, the Awards Regulations, and other documents and rules necessary for holding the Awards.

4.1.6. The Directorate's responsibilities include:

- defining the main areas of focus for the Awards;
- involving partners and sponsors in the organization and implementation of the Awards stages and events;
- approving support measures for Contestants and winners of the Awards;
- approving the schedule of key Awards events;
- promoting the development of the Awards;
- performing other duties related to the organization and holding of the Awards.

4.1.7. Meetings of the Directorate are convened as needed to achieve the objectives of the Awards.

4.1.7.1. Meetings of the Directorate may be held remotely.

4.2. The Expert Council is a selection committee composed of representatives from the professional community and the Awards' partners.

4.2.1. The Expert Council is formed by the Awards Directorate on behalf of ANO Evrazia.

4.2.2. The Expert Council selects the finalists for the Award.

4.2.3. The Expert Council decides whether to disqualify applications from participation in the Awards in accordance with these Regulations.

4.3. The Supervisory Board is a collective body composed of representatives of professional communities in Eurasian countries who are active in various spheres of public life.

4.3.1. The Supervisory Board is formed by the Awards Directorate on behalf of ANO Evrazia.

4.3.2. The Supervisory Board oversees compliance with transparency and fairness in the methodology for holding the Awards, the work of the Expert Council, the Organizing Committee, and the Jury, and certifies the list of Awards

winners.

4.4. The Organizing Committee is established to organize and conduct the Awards.

The Awards Organizing Committee is formed by the he Awards Directorate on behalf of ANO Evrazia.

4.4.1. The Organizing Committee is formed annually by the Awards Directorate.

4.4.2. The Organizing Committee is responsible for receiving, reviewing, and selecting applications for participation.

4.4.3. The Organizing Committee forwards verified applications to the Expert Council for review and to compile a list of finalists.

4.4.4. The Organizing Committee monitors and facilitates the work of the Expert Council and submits the list of Awards Finalists to the Jury for the selection of the winners.

4.4.5. The Organizing Committee is responsible for the technical aspects of the open international vote.

4.4.6. The Organizing Committee liaises with Awards Contestants during the collection and processing of Applications, the selection of finalists, and the arrangement for nominees to participate in live and remote (online) events and the Awards Ceremony.

4.4.7. Decisions made by the Organizing Committee are binding on Awards Contestants.

4.5. A jury is formed for the organizing and holding of the Awards.

4.5.1. The jury is selected by the Awards Directorate on behalf of ANO Evrazia.

4.5.2. The Awards jury is composed of members of the Expert Council, the Supervisory Board, and other leaders of professional communities in Eurasian countries and partners of the Award.

4.5.3. The jury makes a collective decision on the awards of prizes from among the list of finalists in each category, based on its evaluation of the live

presentations of the Awards finalists' projects.

4.5.3.1. The results of the evaluation are announced during the Prizegiving Ceremony.

5. Requirements for Awards Contestants

5.1. Individuals aged 14 or older who reside in any country in the world and who share the Awards Goals and Objectives are eligible to participate in the Awards as Contestants.

5.2. Registration on behalf of minor Contestants is carried out by their legal representatives (parents, guardians or other legal representatives).

5.3. Legal entities (commercial and nonprofit organizations) that are registered and operate in any country worldwide and share the Awards Goals and Objectives,

5.4. and also teams and arts ensembles that are not registered as legal entities, operate in any country in the world, and share the Awards Goals and Objectives, are eligible to participate in the Awards.

5.5. Past Contestants in any of the categories are eligible to participate in the Awards.

5.6. Last year's awards winners are not eligible to participate.

6. Procedure for the submission, collection, review, and evaluation of applications

6.1. The Questionnaire for Awards Contestants and the Application Form can be found on the official website of the Awards.

6.2. Contestants submit their applications by filling out an online form on the Awards website.

6.2.1. Applications submitted in paper or via email will not be accepted for review.

6.3. Registration for participation, as well as actual participation in the Awards, is voluntary and implies the full consent of the Contestants and the legal

representatives of minor Contestants to these Regulations, the privacy policy, and the processing of personal data.

6.4. Application submission stage:

6.4.1. During the application period from April 7 to August 30, 2026, Contestants submit their applications on the Awards website in accordance with the categories specified in Section 7 of these Regulations.

6.4.1.1. The Awards Committee reserves the right to extend the application period by posting the relevant information on the Awards website.

6.4.2. A Contestant may submit an application in as many categories as they wish (but no more than 3), however, a Contestant may win only in one category;

6.4.3. The application must be submitted using the approved form in Russian and must be completed in full.

6.4.3.1. The application must be accompanied by the Contestant's questionnaire and the relevant materials and documents in Russian.

6.4.4. The submitted applications undergo a technical review by the Organizing Committee to ensure they meet the requirements of these Regulations.

6.4.4.1. The results of the technical review are displayed in the Contestant's personal account on the Awards website and are sent to the email address provided by the Contestant when filling out the application form on the Awards website.

6.4.4.2. The Awards Organizing Committee has the right to request additional information about an Awards Contestant or other information related to the Application in accordance with these Regulations.

6.4.4.3. Works and projects carried out in the interests of the countries of the Eurasian continent, in accordance with the goals and objectives of the Awards and the nomination criteria during the period from January 1, 2020, to June 30, 2026, are eligible for submission.

6.4.4.4. A Contestant's application may be referred back for revision by a decision of the Awards Organizing Committee during the technical review stage if the application contains insufficient information or has been filled out incorrectly.

6.4.4.5. A Contestant's application may be withdrawn from the competition by decision of the Awards Organizing Committee during the technical review stage if it does not comply with the requirements of the Awards Regulations.

6.5. The expert review of applications stage:

6.5.1. Applications for the Award that have passed the technical review stage and meet all competition requirements are forwarded by the Organizing Committee to the Expert Council for review and evaluation.

6.5.2. A Contestant's application may be withdrawn from the competition if, during the evaluation of the submitted application, the Expert Council receives information indicating a material inaccuracy in the data provided.

6.5.2.1. The decision to withdraw an application from the competition is made by the Expert Council and communicated to the Contestant by the Awards Organizing Committee via the Contestant's personal account on the Awards website and sent by email;

6.5.3. If a single Contestant submits entries in multiple categories, only one entry will be admitted to the finals, as determined by the highest score awarded by the Expert Council.

6.5.3.1. If a Contestant's entries in multiple categories receive the same number of points, the entry in the category recommended by the Organizing Committee will advance to the finals;

6.5.4. The results of the expert review are published in the Contestants' personal accounts on the Awards website and/or sent to the email address provided by the Contestant as their preferred method of contact.

6.5.5. Based on the results of the expert review and the points earned by the Contestants, a list of finalists is compiled.

6.5.6. In each category, the 10 contestants with the highest scores advance to the finals.

6.5.7. Points are awarded by the Expert Council for each of the main criteria (paragraph 9 of these Regulations).

6.5.7.1. Each application is evaluated by at least three members of the

Expert Council.

6.5.7.2. As a result of the Organizing Committee's evaluation, the average score for each criterion and the total score for all criteria of the Nomination are calculated.

6.5.7.3. The Organizing Committee, in consultation with the Awards Supervisory Board, tallies the scores and determines the winners.

6.6. The live presentation of proposals and selection of winners stage (Finals).

6.6.1. Awards Contestants who have advanced to the finals based on the results of the expert review (those who received the highest scores) are invited to present their projects in person before the Awards Jury to determine the winners.

6.6.2. The live presentations, the announcement of the winners, and the awards ceremony for the Awards will take place over a four-day period between October 19 and October 28, in Moscow.

6.6.3. Contestants who have advanced to the finals of the Awards based on the results of the expert review but who decline to participate in the live presentation will be disqualified from the finals. In such a case, that person's position in the finals will go to the Contestant with the next highest number of points.

6.6.4. Contestants who have advanced to the finals of the Awards based on the results of the expert review, and who confirmed their participation in the live presentation but did not attend, retain their status as finalists but are not eligible for prize-winning places.

6.6.5. Based on the results of the live presentations, the jury selects the winners: the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places in each category.

6.6.5.1. The winners are determined by a secret ballot, with each member of the jury assigning points.

6.6.5.2. Points are awarded by the members of the jury for each of the main criteria (Section 9 of these Regulations).

6.6.5.3. Each entry is evaluated by at least three members of the jury.

6.6.5.4. As a result of the Organizing Committee's evaluation, the average score for each criterion and the total score for all criteria of the Nomination are calculated.

6.6.5.5. The Organizing Committee, in consultation with the Awards Supervisory Board, tallies the scores and determines the winners.

6.6.5.6. The winners are announced at the awards ceremony.

6.6.6. Expenses related to the organizing of finalists' participation in the live presentation stage and the Awards Ceremony (their travel from their place of residence to the venue, in Moscow, and back, lodging and meals, attendance at all program events, use of necessary materials, and the cultural program) are covered by funds provided by the Founder (ANO Evrazia).

6.7. Open International Voting:

6.7.1. International voting will take place from October 5 to October 18, 2025 via an online voting system on the Awards website, and one winner of the International Voting will be selected in each category.

6.7.2. The applications receiving the highest scores in each category based on the expert review are eligible for the open international vote, up to a limit of 10 applications per category.

6.7.3. Information about the Awards winners is confidential. Individuals familiar with the results are responsible for keeping the winners' identities confidential until they are announced at the awards ceremony.

6.8. Selection and Announcement of the Winners.

6.8.1. The Organizing Committee of the Awards determines the winners (1st, 2nd, and 3rd place) in each category by tallying the scores awarded by the jury members, with the participation of the Supervisory Board.

6.8.2. The winners of the open international vote (one winner in each category) is conducted by the Awards Organizing Committee by tallying the number of votes (one vote equals one point) received through online voting on the Awards website, with the participation of the Supervisory Board;

6.8.3. The prizegiving ceremony honoring the winners of the Awards will take place between 19.10.2026 and 15.11.2026, in Moscow. (The exact date of the prizegiving ceremony will be determined at a later time.)

7. Awards Categories

7.1. Individuals and legal entities, groups of individuals, and arts ensembles that promote the ideas of international cooperation and traditional values are invited to participate in the competition.

7.2. These Regulations establish the following categories for applications submitted by Contestants:

7.2.1. Global Language - for a significant contribution to the promotion of the Russian language as a means of intercultural communication in the countries of the Eurasian region. For individuals and legal entities.

7.2.2. Cultural Code - for the implementation of projects in the fields of culture and the arts aimed at preserving traditional values and fostering intercultural exchange. For individuals and legal entities.

7.2.3. Bridges of Friendship - for promoting international cooperation in the social and cross-cultural spheres across Eurasia. For individuals and legal entities.

7.2.4. Eurasia Leader - for personal contributions to the creation of projects that have had a significant impact on the development of public life in Eurasia. For individuals.

7.2.5. Memory of Generations - for projects aimed at preserving historical memory and the truth, and combating the falsification of history. For individuals and legal entities.

7.2.6. Voice of Eurasia - for providing objective coverage of Eurasian integration, cultural heritage, and social initiatives, as well as countering the distortion of facts regarding world events. For individuals and legal entities.

7.2.7. Bright Start - for original ideas and projects aimed at developing international cooperation and promoting traditional values. For teenagers aged

14–17.

7.2.8. Art of Teaching - for contributions to the development of the system of upbringing and education of the younger generation in accordance with traditional values. For individuals and legal entities.

7.2.9. Follow Your Heart - for active volunteer work and the development of projects in the field of healthcare. For individuals and legal entities.

7.3. By the Board of Directors The Board may establish additional awards categories.

8. Procedure for Awarding Prizes

8.1. The winners of the Awards are individuals determined in accordance with these Regulations and the decision of the Awards Jury and/or the results of the public vote.

8.1.1. The Awards Jury's decision and the voting results are final and cannot be appealed.

8.2. A cash prizes will be awarded only if the winner complies with all the terms and conditions of these Regulations and the Organizer's requirements.

8.3. To receive a cash prize, the winner must submit the following by the deadline set by the Organizer:

- accurate and complete personal data, as well as consent to its processing, storage, and transfer;
- documents verifying identity and legal capacity;
- their bank account details;
- other information upon request from the Organizer.

8.3.1. Failure to submit, late submission, or submission of inaccurate or incomplete information will be considered a refusal by the winner to accept the cash prize.

8.4. The Organizer reserves the right to refuse to enter into an agreement and/or pay a cash prize, without any compensation, in the following cases:

- failure by the winner to comply with these Regulations;

- the inability to determine a winner;
- non-compliance of the submitted data with the requirements of the law of the Russian Federation;
- the adoption of sanctions and prohibitions, i.e. regulatory acts that directly or indirectly prohibit or restrict the right to enter into a contract with the winning bidder, whether imposed by foreign states against the Russian Federation or imposed by the Russian Federation against foreign states;
- refusal by banks or payment systems to process a transaction;
- the discovery that submitted information is inaccurate;
- other circumstances that make it impossible to award the prize and that are beyond the Organizer's control.

8.4.1. The Organizer's decision in such cases is final and cannot be contested.

8.5. Cash prizes will be paid exclusively by bank transfer and only after the relevant agreement has been signed.

8.6. The Organizer is not liable for any failure to transfer funds due to reasons beyond its control.

8.6.1. Currency and International Restrictions:

8.6.1.1. Payment may be made in the currency of the Russian Federation.

8.6.2. The winner is solely responsible for all costs and risks associated with:

- currency conversion;
- bank fees;
- restrictions imposed by financial (payment) systems.

8.7. Taxes and Mandatory Payments:

8.7.1. The winner is solely responsible for paying all taxes and fees associated with receiving a cash prize.

8.8. Restrictions under international law:

8.8.1. If payment of the cash prize is not possible due to:

- the adoption of sanctions and prohibitions, i.e. regulatory acts that directly or indirectly prohibit or and affect the fulfillment of the Organizer's obligations,

whether imposed by foreign states against the Russian Federation or imposed by the Russian Federation against foreign states;

- prohibitions on currency transfers, currency and/or trade restrictions, and the disconnection of banks in the Russian Federation from SWIFT, the international interbank system for the transmission of information and the processing of payments;
- closure of borders (affecting travel by land, river, lake, sea, or air);
- any actions or omissions by foreign states, as well as the adoption of any legal instruments by foreign states, their associations, or intergovernmental bodies, related to sanctions against the Russian Federation, legal entities or individuals associated with the Russian Federation, and their employees, management bodies, and beneficiaries, and the imposition of economic sanctions on the basis of decisions by authorities of foreign states;
- the requirements of the laws of any applicable jurisdiction;

8.9. The Organizer has the right, at its discretion, to:

- change the payment method;
- defer payment;
- or refuse payment entirely, without compensation.

8.10. Termination of the right to receive a prize:

8.10.1. The right to receive a cash prize is forfeited in the following cases:

- violations of the Regulations;
- failure to provide documents;
- inability to make payment for reasons beyond the Organizer's control;
- the expiration of the specified deadline for claiming the prize.

8.11. Disclaimer:

8.11.1. The Organizer shall not be liable to the Contestant (winner) under the following circumstances:

- armed conflicts: the imposition of martial law, military operations of any kind, war (declared or undeclared), preparations for war, revolutions, uprisings, civil unrest, blockades, seizures of power, mobilization, invasions,

mutinies, civil disturbances;

- industrial action - lockouts, strikes or boycotts;
- prolonged disruptions to transportation, telecommunications, information systems, or energy resources;
- transportation or supply difficulties: inability to use, or restrictions on the use of, railways, ports, airports, river transport, or roads;
- sanctions and prohibitions; the adoption of regulations that directly or indirectly prohibit or restrict activities;
- the disconnection of banks in the Russian Federation, Moscow, and/or the servicing bank from SWIFT, the international interbank system for the transmission of information and the processing of payments;
- the closure of borders (affecting travel by land, river, lake, sea or air); any actions or omissions by foreign states, as well as the adoption of any legal instruments by foreign states, their associations, or intergovernmental bodies, related to sanctions against the Russian Federation, legal entities or individuals associated with the Russian Federation, and their employees, management bodies, and beneficiaries, and the imposition of economic sanctions on the basis of decisions by authorities of foreign states;

8.12. Expenses incurred by a Contestant that are not specifically listed in these Regulations will not be paid or reimbursed by the Organizer.

8.13. Acceptance of Terms

8.13.1. By participating in the Awards a Contestant accepts, in full and unconditionally, these terms and conditions, including the Organizer's right to make decisions regarding the payment of cash prizes at its sole discretion.

9. Criteria for Evaluating Applications

9.1. Criteria for evaluating applications for the Award:

9.1.1. The project's or activity's alignment with the goals of the Awards and the specific category.

9.1.2. The project's social significance and relevance to society;

9.1.3. Its scale and scope. The project's geographic reach, the number of Contestants involved, and the extent of its impact on the target audience.

9.1.4. Its innovation and uniqueness. The originality of the proposed solution, its ability to address existing problems in new ways, and the extent to which it incorporates new technologies or methods that distinguish the project from similar solutions on the market and provides significant advantages.

9.1.5. Results and evidence of effectiveness. An analysis of the project's specific achievements, such as quantitative and qualitative indicators demonstrating its success, as well as the mandatory inclusion of supporting materials confirming the impact of the implemented activities on the target audience and the project's alignment with its stated goals and objectives.

9.1.6. Resource Support. This includes an analysis of the team's experience in implementing similar projects, the professional competence of the team members, and the structure and nature of interaction within the team.

9.2. The criteria for evaluating applications for the Awards are the same for each category.

10. Application requirements and responsibilities of the parties

10.1. The entry must meet the requirements set forth in these Regulations;

10.2. The content of the application, including any references to third-party sources, must be open and accessible throughout the duration of the Awards;

10.3. By submitting an application, the Contestant confirms that the entry:

- is the result of the Contestant's own intellectual activity;
- is consistent with the selected category and the objectives of the Awards;
- does not contain any unethical and/or obscene language or images, or erotic and/or pornographic content;
- does not contain obscene and/or offensive images, including those related to a person's gender, race, nationality, profession, social class, age, or language, or official state symbols (flags, coats of arms, anthems), religious

symbols, or cultural heritage sites (historical and cultural monuments) of any nation;

- does not contain calls for violence, does not promote terrorism, extremism, or fascism, and does not incite interethnic, racial, religious, or other discord;
- does not infringe upon the honor and dignity of other Contestants or other individuals;
- does not infringe on the rights of third parties;
- does not contain obscene or offensive images, or images depicting smoking or the consumption of alcoholic beverages, or images of narcotic drugs or plants containing narcotic or psychotropic substances.

10.4. By submitting an entry, the Contestant agrees that, in the event of a violation of Section 10.3 of these Rules, their participation in the Awards will be automatically terminated, and if such an entry is selected as a semifinalist, finalist, or winner, the consequences of such selection will be voided.

10.5. By submitting a competition entry, the Contestant consents to the following:

- the posting of information about the Winners and publishing of competition entries or portions thereof on the Awards website and on the Organizers' social media accounts, as well as on the websites of the official partners of the Awards, including in the media;
- the use of photographs and videos depicting Awards Contestants that were taken during the Awards and related events.

10.6. Submissions will not be returned or reviewed.

10.7. The submitting organization or Contestant is responsible for the content of the materials submitted in connection with the Awards.

10.8. All claims by third parties regarding the content of submissions, the accuracy and legality of Contestants' activities, the materials submitted, the results of work performed, and other activities conducted in connection with the Awards, including claims by creators, their heirs and rights holders, must be

resolved by the Contestant independently and at their own expense.

10.9. The Directorate and the Organizing Committee reserve the right to verify the authorship and originality of submissions in any manner they deem appropriate.

10.10. The Directorate and the Organizing Committee have the right to immediately suspend or terminate the rights of Awards Contestants, after notifying them of such termination, in the event of a violation of these Regulations.

10.11. The following may constitute grounds for exclusion from participation in the Awards:

(a) the submission by an applicant, Contestant, candidate for nomination, or nominee of a request to be excluded from the Award;

(b) the submission of forged documents or knowingly false information about the Contestant when completing the application, or a violation of the procedure for registration via the Website, as established by these Regulations;

(c) the publication of information and data that violate the current laws of the Russian Federation;

(d) the infringement of third parties' rights to intellectual property contained in materials submitted to the Directorate by an applicant, a candidate for nomination, or a nominee for the Award;

(e) having a criminal record (including one that has been expunged or expired) or having been sentenced to a penalty pursuant to a final and binding court judgment, being under investigation, or having been disqualified by a court decision from holding public office;

(e) calls for extremist activity, public incitement, justification, or defense of extremism, social, racial, national, or religious discord; the denigration of national dignity; the promotion of the exclusivity, superiority, or inferiority of citizens based on their religious, social, racial, national, religious, or linguistic affiliation, or on other grounds; the promotion and public display of Nazi paraphernalia or symbols, or paraphernalia or symbols that are so similar as to be easily confused

for such paraphernalia or symbols;

(g) the posting on the Website, or the Organizer's personal social media pages and official social media pages, by means of text messages, graphics, and/or video images, or by any other means, of information whose content is offensive to nomination candidates or nominees, people supporting Contestants, or other individuals, or that may be regarded as such, as well as information that discredits Contestants, citizens supporting the Contestants, or other individuals, contains threats, calls for violence, the commission of unlawful acts, anti-social or immoral acts, or the commission of any other actions that contradict the foundations of the rule of law and morality;

(g) the publishing of false or defamatory information about the Awards, nomination candidates or nominees, or people who support them;

(i) the use of pseudoscientific data or fabricated scientific research in submissions;

(k) The Directorate and the Organizing Committee reserve the right to bar from participation in the Awards any individuals suspected of failing to comply with the rules set forth in Section 11.3 of these Regulations, without providing an explanation or evidence.

10.12. The Awards Organizing Committee is not responsible for the nature or accuracy of the information provided by Contestants or by persons participating in events supporting Contestants, nor for information made available to the public during the course of the Awards.

10.13. If, during the course of the Awards, it is determined that there has been a violation of applicable law in any form, including a violation of third parties' rights to intellectual property used by an Awards Contestant, the Directorate and the Organizing Committee of the Competition reserve the right to exclude from further participation in the Competition the Contestant or individual supporting Competition Contestants who committed such a violation, and to remove all data published by them from public access.

10.14. The information set forth in these Regulations regarding the

procedures and rules for conducting the Awards is posted on the Website.

10.15. Any amendments to these Regulations will be published on the Website.

10.16. If a Contestant continues to participate in the Awards, he or she agrees to the changes made to these Rules.

11. Final Provisions

11.1. The Founder of the Awards and the Directorate reserve the right to use information about Contestants, their applications, and their projects (except for information constituting a trade secret) for publication in the media and on other platforms during the selection and voting processes and after the conclusion of the Awards.

11.2. Expenses related to the participation of Contestants, members of the Expert Council, members of the Jury, and members of the Supervisory Board in the live presentation stage and the Awards Ceremony (their travel from their place of residence to the venue, in Moscow, and back, lodging and meals, attendance at all program events, use of necessary materials, and the cultural program) are covered by funds provided by the Founder (ANO Evrazia).

11.3. Awards Contestants grant the Directorate the right to publish on the Website the materials provided to the Directorate and to use them in the following ways: reproduction, distribution, public display, public performance, broadcast and cable transmission, making such materials available to the general public by posting them on the Internet worldwide for purposes connected with participation in the Awards.
